OPTION A: "Too posh to push myth' exposed, say researchers

One in four babies is delivered by caesarean section in Britain, a procedure which has more than doubled since the 1980s. Far from being an "easy alternative" to traditional labour, it is regarded as major surgery. Like any major operation, it carries the risk of bleeding and infection, and the wound can also make it harder for a new mother to cope in the first few weeks following birth. So it is reserved for cases in which natural birth is more risky.

However, the high rate of caesareans remains a controversial issue in the UK. It has been suspected that some low-risk women are being offered it for non-medical reasons. The study published in the British Medical Journal looked at data for more than 620,000 single baby births in England in 2008. Of these, 147,726 were delivered by caesarean section, and the reasons for this choice were analysed. Medical reasons were found to be the most common. For instance, more than half of the c-sections carried out in the UK were done as emergencies. Also, a clear majority of women with medical complications in labour, mostly related to previous caesareans, to obesity or to older age, had the operation too. There was no indication that low-risk women were being given caesareans inappropriately, which dismantles the myth that women undergo c-sections to avoid pain.

Mervi Jokinen, from the Royal College of Midwives, expressed her satisfaction that women's choices were no longer being blamed for increasing caesarean rates. She said: "The massive reason for the rise of c-sections is the threat of litigation. Hospitals fear legal actions against them if anything goes wrong.
